

















School-Based Assessment Shifts: 30-60-90 Plans

End of Year Goals (Written as SMART Goals):

<u>SEL Goal</u>: By the end of the year, 100% of students will have someone to whom they can turn for assistance and feel comfortable stating their opinion in class as measured by advisory surveys throughout the year.

100% of students will answer "yes" when asked if they have a person to whom they can talk, measured by an advisory survey.

100% of students will answer "yes" when asked if they feel comfortable stating their opinion in class.

<u>PoG Goal</u>: By the end of the year, 100% of our staff will teach and assess all 6 competencies of the Profile of a Graduate using the performance outcomes and single point rubrics. 100% of students will show evidence of the competencies through 2 exhibitions (5th grade defense of learning).

<u>Academic (Reading & Math)</u>: By May of 2022, 75% of students will score at the proficient level or higher in the areas of reading and mathematics and 100% of students will grow at least one grade level in a year's time using the DRA & MAP assessment tools.
